


COMMUNITY NARRATIVES



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

UNDERSTANDING BARRIERS Primavalle faces both topographical and structural barriers.






Poor/inadequate/Partially No sidewalks or crosswalks



The fences around Parco Anna Bracci are barriers that isolate the park from the pedestrian network.



The walls create impermeable blocks that severely restrict pedestrian accessibility and connectivity.



Many sidewalks in the focus area are occupied by parked automobiles, making them unusable for pedestrians.



Piazza Clemente XI is the most pedestrian-unfriendly space, dominated by high automobile traffic.



Topographical features can also be physical barriers that obstruct pedestrian traffic.



Map 2.1 Pedestrian Network overlaid with barriers demonstrat accessibility and permeability. We define pedestrian permeability as "the capacity of pedestrian connections to carry people," - adapted from Stephen Marshall's work on permeability






